Youth on community supervision (ages 12-18)



More than half of nonincarcerated justice-involved youth consistently use condoms.

Pregnancy Likelihood

Young people who are arrested are significantly more likely to have a child by age 25



At least 1 in 10 young people who experience the justice system will experience teen pregnancy
