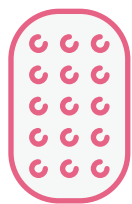
48%

Among high school students:

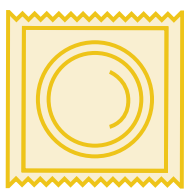
	Average age at first sex	Ever had sexual intercourse	Used alcohol or drugs during last sex

When students experiencing homelessness last had sex:



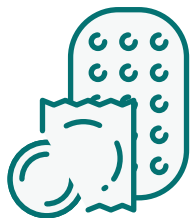
